Richard Francis Wagner passed away on 6 May 2019

USS Bremerton (CA-130), was a Baltimore-class heavy cruiser, named for the city of Bremerton in Washington state / She was commissioned on 29 April 1945 and served as flagship for the Atlantic Fleet / She joined the 7th Fleet for her first cruise of the Korean War zone / Her guns blasted enemy lines at Wonsan, Kojo, Chongjin, and Changjon Hang, Korea / On 13 September 1952 she was relieved and returned to Long Beach / On 5 April 1953 Bremerton again departed Long Beach for a tour with the 7th Fleet / Upon joining TF 77 her guns pounded enemy installations, troops, and railroads in Korea / Completing her tour in November 1953, Bremerton returned to Long Beach / From 19955 through 1957, the Bremerton was assigned to the Pacific fleet / Bremerton was decommissioned on 29 July 1960 after serving a total of 11.5 years in commissioned service / She lingered in the mothball fleet but was stricken from the Naval Vessel Register on 1 October 1973 / She was sold as scrap to Zidell Explorations Corp., Portland Oregon on 11 July 1974

Private First-Class Thomas "Beaver" J. Wagner served as a Field Artillery Cannoneer and also served as a Machine Gunner while involved in several campaigns during the Korean War, including the infamous Chosin Reservoir battle

While attached to Battery K, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines, 1st Marine Division, on 29 November 1950 PFC Wagner performed conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity during intense action against the enemy, earning him a Silver Star / The next day, he was wounded in action, earning him a Purple Heart

Thomas Wagner received his Honorable Discharge from the United States Marine Corps on 31 January 1952 / Wagner was a lifetime member of the International Union of Operating Engineers and worked out of Local 17, Buffalo for over 40 years / Thomas "Beaver" J. Wagner passed away on 17 March 2018 at the age of 87 years old / Thomas Wagner is interred in the Forest Lawn Cemetery's Veterans Field of Valor

The 11th Marine Regiment is an artillery regiment of the Marine Corps and is known as the "Canon Cockers" / The 11th marine Regiment fought in many Korean combat actions from 1950 - 1952 / The 11th Marines left Korea in March 1955

The Silver Star Medal (SSM) is the United States Armed Forces' third-highest military decoration for valor in combat / The Silver Star Medal is awarded primarily to members of the United States Armed Forces for gallantry in action against an

enemy of the United States / The gallantry displayed must have taken place while in action against an enemy of the United States, while engaged in military operations involving conflict with an opposing foreign force



Joseph Walker Jr. was a member of Veterans of Foreign Wars VFW Post 2940

USS Ampere (PCE-919/AM-359/YDG-11/ADG-11) was originally planned as a PCE-905-class patrol craft for the United States Navy, PCE-919, and laid down as an Admirable-class minesweeper, named Drake, for the male duck / Before she was commissioned, her name was cancelled and she was reclassified as a District Degaussing Vessel (the ship's hull, made of steel, acts like a large floating magnet surrounded by an even larger magnetic field / When the ship moves through the water, the magnetic field moves along with it and produces disturbance in the earth's magnetic field / She was later renamed Ampere, after the ampere, a unit of electric current, which takes its name from the French physicist André-Marie Ampère / Drake was laid down on 24 November 1943, at Portland, Oregon by the Willamette Iron and Steel Works, and launched on 12 August 1944 / On 20 April 1945, her name was canceled, and she was re-designated as a degaussing vessel, YDG-11 / The ship was placed in service on 15 August 1945, the day after the Japanese surrender

The Republic of Korea Presidential Unit Citation was awarded to units of the United Nations Command for service in Korea during the Korean Conflict from 1950 to 1954 / In recognition of allied military service to South Korea during the Korean War, all United States military departments were authorized the unit award for that period

The National Defense Service Medal (NDSM) is a service award of the United States Armed Forces established by President Dwight D. Eisenhower in 1953 / The National Defense Service Medal (NDSM) was first intended to be a "blanket campaign medal" awarded to service members who served honorably during a designated time period of which a "national emergency" had been declared during a time of war or conflict / It may also be issued to active military members for any other period that the Secretary of Defense designates / Currently, the National Defense Service Medal is the oldest service medal (as opposed to decorations for particular achievements such as valor or meritorious service and Good Conduct Medals) currently awarded by all branches of the United States Armed Forces

The Good Conduct Medal is one of the oldest military awards of the United States Armed Forces / The Navy Good Conduct Medal was established in 1869, the Marine Corps version in 1896, the Coast Guard version in 1923, the Army version in 1941, and the Air Force version in 1963 / The medal is awarded to any active-duty enlisted member of the United States military who completes three consecutive years of "honorable and faithful service" / Such service implies that a standard enlistment was completed without any non-judicial punishment, disciplinary infractions, or court martial offenses



Thomas Walton was a charter member and EMT with the Eden Emergency Squad / Walton was a 62-year member of the Hamburg American Legion Post 527, and a life member of the VFW Post 8647 in Mayville, NY / Thomas E. Walton passed away at the age of 91 years old on 10 May 2022

The USS Van Valkenburgh (DD-656), a Fletcher-class destroyer named for Captain Franklin Van Valkenburgh, captain of the battleship Arizona when the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor / The Van Valkensurgh was commissioned on 2 August 1944 / The destroyer participated in the Battle of Iwo Jima and Okinawa during World War II / In August 1950, two months after North Korea invaded South Korea, the Navy recommissioned Van Valkenburgh's at Charleston on 8 March 1951 / In August 1951, the destroyer commenced a period of operations in support of the I Corps, Republic of Korea (ROK) Army / Over the ensuing days, Van Valkenburgh expended over 2,400 rounds of ammunition against a variety of targets, ranging from houses to bunkers, artillery positions to sampans, trenches to tents and supply dumps, frequently using air spotters / She conducted her patrol operations in company with ROK YMS-5H / On one occasion, 9 August 1952, Van Valkenburgh dueled with a communist shore battery / Taking 10 rounds of 76-millimeter projectiles from Suwan Dan, the destroyer returned immediate counterbattery and slow destructive fire, using airspot, expending 51 rounds of 5-inch projectiles / After a week's upkeep at Subic Bay, from 10 to 17 October, Van Valkenburgh headed for the United States / Taken to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania in August 1953, Van Valkenburgh remained in reserve at that port until she was decommissioned on 26 February 1954 / Van Valkenburgh won the Navy Unit Commendation for her service off Okinawa, was awarded three battle stars for her World War II duty and received one for Korean War operation

USS Van Valkenburgh (DD-656) was a Fletcher-class destroyer of the United States Navy, named for Captain Franklin Van Valkenburgh (1888–1941), captain of the battleship Arizona when the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor / The Van Valkenburgh was commissioned on 2 August 1944 and operated out of Pearl Harbor, engaging in an intensive slate of training activities making practice torpedo runs, antiaircraft firings, and shore bombardments / In February 1945, the Van Valkenburgh participated in the bombardment and transport of Marines for the Battle of Iwo Jima / The Van Valkenburgh also participated in the Battle of Okinawa / In August 1951, the Van Valkenburgh commenced a period of operations in support of the I Corps, Republic of Korea (ROK) Army / Over the ensuing days, Van Valkenburgh expended over 2,400 rounds of ammunition against a variety of targets, ranging from houses to bunkers, artillery positions to sampans, trenches to tents and supply dumps, frequently using air spotters / On one occasion, 9 August 1952, Van Valkenburgh dueled with a communist shore battery / Taking 10 rounds of 76-millimeter projectiles from Suwan Dan, the destroyer returned immediate counterbattery and slow destructive fire, using air spotters, expending 51 rounds of 5-inch projectiles / The Van Valkenburgh was decommissioned on 26 February 1954 and transferred on loan to the Government

of Turkey on 28 February 1967, Van Valkenburgh became TCG İzmir (D 341) and operated with the Turkish Navy into the early 1970s / Struck from the U.S. Navy List on 1 February 1973, the destroyer was returned to the United States on 15 February but was simultaneously sold to Turkey / The Van Valkenburgh won the Navy Unit Commendation for her service off Okinawa, was awarded three battle stars for her World War II duty and received one for Korean War operations

The Korean War Service Medal, also known as the Republic of Korea War Service Medal, is a military award of South Korea which was first authorized in December 1950 / The Korean War Service Medal was first authorized to South Korean troops who had participated in the initial counter-assaults against North Korean aggression in June 1950 / On 15 September 1951, President Syngman Rhee referred to and authorized the commander-chief of the United Nations Command to confer the award of the "Korean War Medal" and "Korean War Ribbon" ("Korean War Service Medal"), "to the brave and valiant members of the United Nations Command who have been, and are now, combating the communist aggressor in Korea"

Clyde Webb was Honorably Discharged from the United States Navy on 16 July 1952 / Clyde E. Webb passed away on 22 September 2021

USS Cabot (CVL-28/AVT-3) was an Independence-class light aircraft carrier in the United States Navy, the second ship to carry the name / Cabot was commissioned in 24 July 1943 and served until 1947 / During World War II, the Cabot participated in the battles of Palaus, Yap, Ulithi, and Woleai at the close of March 1944 / The Cabot and its Air Group 31 pounded Japanese bases on Iwo Jima, Pagan, Rota, Guam, Yap and Ulithi as the carrier continued her support of the Marianas operation until 9 August 1944 / She was recommissioned as a training carrier from 1948 to 1955 / From 1967 to 1989, she served in Spain as Dédalo / After attempts to preserve her failed, the Cabot was scrapped in 2002 / The USS Cabot earned nine Battle Stars during World War II

The Navy Occupation Service Medal is a military award of the United States Navy which was "Awarded to commemorate the services of Navy, Marine Corps and Coast Guard personnel in the occupation of certain territories of the enemies of the U.S. during World War II" and recognized those personnel who participated in the European and Asian occupation forces during, and following World War II / The medal was also bestowed to personnel who performed duty in West Berlin between 1945 and 1990

Fireman, Interior Communications Electrician Striker Harvey G. Whitney served aboard the USS Leyte for 33 months and the USS Curtiss for 5 months

Harvey Whitney was Honorably Discharged from the United States Navy on 11 February 1952 / Whitney was a member of the Patriot Guard Riders / Harvey G. Whitney passed away on 21 July 2020

USS Leyte (CV/CVA/CVS-32, AVT-10) was one of 24 Essex-class aircraft carriers built during and shortly after World War II for the United States Navy / The ship was the third US Navy ship to bear the name / Leyte was commissioned on 11 April 1946, too late to serve in World War II / She spent most of her career in the Atlantic, Caribbean, and Mediterranean, but also saw service in the Korean War, in which she earned two battle stars / She was reclassified in the early 1950s as an attack carrier (CVA), then as an Antisubmarine Aircraft Carrier (CVS), and finally (after inactivation) as an aircraft transport (AVT) / She was redesignated AVT-10 and decommissioned on 15 May 1959, and was assigned to the Philadelphia group of the Atlantic Reserve Fleet, where she remained until sold for scrap in September 1970

USS Curtiss (AV-4) was the first purpose-built seaplane tender constructed for the United States Navy / She was named for Glenn Curtiss, an American naval aviation pioneer that designed the Curtiss NC-4, the first aircraft to fly across the Atlantic Ocean / The Curtiss was commissioned on 15 November 1940 /Curtiss operated out of Norfolk, Virginia, and in the Caribbean for training and in fleet exercises through the spring of 1941 / On 26 May 1941, she got underway for Pearl Harbor, from which she served as local guard ship, as well as tending two patrol bomber squadrons / When the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor on 7 December, Curtiss was able to get underway and returned fire at the attacking Japanese

aircraft / At 08:36, she sighted the periscope of a Japanese Midget Submarine and opened fire / A torpedo from this submarine missed Curtiss, running over and into a dock at Pearl City / Four minutes later, the same submarine surfaced and was further damaged by gunfire before diving again, after which the destroyer Monaghan sank the submarine with a ram and depth charge attack / After repairs the Curtiss returned to the Pacific and participated in the battles of Noumea, the Solomons and Okinawa / On 21 June 1945 while in Okinawa to serve as flagship for Commander, Fleet Air Wing 1, a kamikaze and its bomb ripped two holes in her hull and detonated on the third deck, killing 35 and wounding 21 of her crew / Damage control kept her afloat and four days later she was underway for an overhaul at Mare Island Navy Yard / Shortly after the outbreak of the Korean War, the Curtiss sailed from San Diego, to join the 7th Fleet in July 1950, on patrol in the Korea Strait / Sailing out of Iwakuni and Kure, she tended two Martin PBM Mariner squadrons and a squadron of British Short Sunderlands operating over Korean territory / The USS Curtiss was decommissioned on 24 September 1957 / The Curtiss was struck from the Naval Vessel Register on 1 July 1963, and was sold for scrapping in February 1972



The United Nations Service Medal for Korea is an international military decoration established by the United Nations on 15 December 1950 as the United Nations Service Medal / The decoration was the first international award ever created by the United Nations and recognized the multi-national defense forces which participated in the Korean War / The United Nations Service Medal (Korea) is awarded to any military service member, of an Armed Force allied with South Korea, who participated in the defense of South Korea from North Korea between the dates of 27 June 1950 and 27 July 1954

The Republic of Korea Presidential Unit Citation was awarded to units of the United Nations Command for service in Korea during the Korean Conflict from 1950 to 1954 / In recognition of allied military service to South Korea during the Korean War, all United States military departments were authorized the unit award for that period
