

The 30th Infantry Division was a unit of the Army National Guard in World War I and World War II / It was nicknamed the "Old Hickory" division, in honor of President Andrew Jackson / The 30th Infantry Division was regarded as the number one American infantry division in the European Theater of Operations (ETO), involved in 282 days of intense combat over a period from June 1944 through April 1945

Specialist Fifth-Class Ronald D. Newton served as an Air Defense Fire Distribution System Crewman and was attached to the 31st Air Defense Artillery Brigade at Lockport Air Force Station, Lockport, NY

Lockport Air Force Station, Lockport, NY - Lockport Air Force Station is a closed United States Air Force ADCOM General Surveillance Radar station in Cambria, New York / Initially established at Fort Niagara in 1950 before relocating to Lockport site, it was a joint USAF and US Army station from 1951 to 1969 / The Air Defense squadron inactivated on 29 June 1979 / The key infrastructure of three radomes (AN/FPS-7 and twin AN/FPS-6 radars) were demolished / Today the former station is partially vacant with base apartments for private use and commercial redevelopment

The 31st Air Defense Artillery Brigade was constituted on 1 January 1918, during World War I, in the National Army as Headquarters, 31st Heavy Artillery Brigade, Coast Artillery Corps at Key West, Florida but would see numerous name changes over the lifetime of the unit / The unit, commanded by Brigadier General George Washington Gatchell, rapidly transitioned into World War I where the brigade earned four battle streamers for participation in the campaigns Aisne-Marne, Oise-Aisne, Meuse-Argonne, and Champagne 1918 / The 31st Brigade was deployed to the European Theater in World War II where it participated in and earned three more battle streamers for campaigns in Rome-Arno, Southern France, and the Rhineland / On 30 June 1946, the

brigade was deactivated at Laned-Sebold, Germany / This unit would encounter numerous activations and inactivations over the years to come to include a 1946 inactivation in Germany, reactivation in 1948 at Fort Bliss, Texas and in 1958 was reorganized as Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 31st Artillery Brigade / The headquarters was inactivated in 1960 at McChord Air Force Base, Washington and then reactivated on 15 December 1961 at Lockport Air Force Station, N.Y., as the 31st Artillery Brigade (Air Defense) / In response to the Cuban Missile Crisis, the brigade was set up with nine Hercules and Hawk battalions defending southern Florida from attack by Cuba and the Soviet Union

The National Defense Service Medal (NDSM) is a service award of the United States Armed Forces established by President Dwight D. Eisenhower in 1953 / It is awarded to every member of the US Armed Forces who has served during any one of four specified periods of armed conflict or national emergency from 1950 to the present / Combat or "in theater" service is not a requirement for the award

The Good Conduct Medal is one of the oldest military awards of the United States Armed Forces / The U.S. Navy's variant of the Good Conduct Medal was established in 1869, the Marine Corps version in 1896, the Coast Guard version in 1923, the Army version in 1941, and the Air Force version in 1963 / The Good Conduct Medal is awarded to any active duty enlisted member of the United States military who completes three consecutive years of "honorable and faithful service" / Such service implies that a standard enlistment was completed without any non-judicial punishment, disciplinary infractions, or court martial offenses





Martin Nowak was Honorably Discharged from the US Marine Corps on 18 March 1969 / Martin E. Nowak passed away on 8 June 2020

The 7th Engineer Support Battalion (7th ESB - "Big Red") is an engineering support unit of the United States Marine Corps and is headquartered at Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton, California / The unit falls under the command of 1st Marine Logistics Group and the I Marine Expeditionary Force / The mission of the 7th Engineer Support Battalion is to provide general engineering support of an expeditionary nature to the Marine Expeditionary Force (MEF), to include mobility, counter mobility and survivability enhancements, Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD), and general supply support to include the handling, storage and distribution of bulk water and fuel

The Vietnam Service Medal is a military award of the United States Armed Forces established on 8 July 1965 by order of President Lyndon B. Johnson / The medal is awarded to recognize service during the Vietnam War by all members of the U.S. Armed Forces provided they meet the award requirements / Service stars were awarded to all services for participation in designated campaigns

The Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal, also known as the Vietnam Campaign Medal is a South Vietnamese military campaign awarded during the Vietnam War (Second Indochina War), the South Vietnamese government awarded the Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal with Device (1960–) to members of the U.S. military for support of operations in Vietnam In May 1966 / The medal was awarded for two different periods of service in Vietnam / The first period for the award was from 8 March 1949 to 20 July 1954 / The second period was from 1 January 1960 to the end of the Vietnam War
